A free keg of bud is in store for that night also. The pledges will come before the brothers after the meeting. The pledges started work on their pledge project (fixing the gutters) and expect to finish it by this Saturday. Robert Wright will not be able to finish pledging this quarter but will continue in the fall.

Athletic- "B" team is tied for first with decks. "A" team is in forth place. The track got ruined out last week so it is now set for this Wednesday at 4:15. Scratch bowling will be held on or around May 27.

Old Business- The motions made at the meeting on April 26, 1971 have been voted on and the results are:
1) The athletic fund motion was defeated.

2) That the black ball system revert back to our old system. (one black ball rule)

-Thank the I.F.C. Sargent-at Arms help all our fraternities in our relationship with the town police.

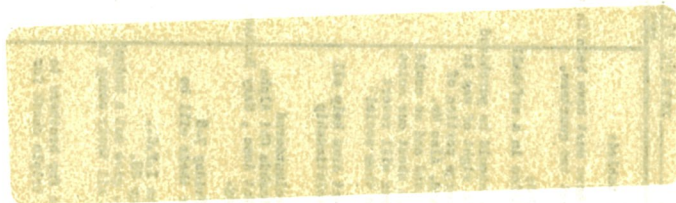
